

Job Posting: Indigenous Outreach & Engagement Coordinator

The <u>Ecological Farmers Association of Ontario</u> (EFAO) is seeking an outgoing, collaborative and community-oriented coordinator with knowledge and/or experience supporting Indigenous food systems and a strong interest in food production/agriculture, to join the staff team as Indigenous Outreach and Engagement Coordinator. Indigenous applicants with experience living in a First Nation Community in northern Ontario are strongly encouraged to apply for this role.

EFAO is an educational and membership organization that supports farmers and growers to build resilient ecological farms and grow a strong knowledge sharing community through farmer-led education, research and community building. Over the past few years the EFAO board and staff team has been building new relationships and collaborations with First Nations communities and Indigenous farmers and land stewards, and this position will enable us to further support this work. This work will involve promoting and supporting the use of ecological farming practices while respecting cultural knowledge among the different Indigenous groups we are working alongside. An area of focus for this position will be working in collaboration with First Nation communities in northern Ontario.

Reporting to EFAO's Northern Outreach, New Farmer Programs and Operations Director and working closely with the Indigenous Outreach and Engagement Steering Committee, the Indigenous Outreach and Engagement Coordinator is responsible for building and nurturing collaborations with First Nations partners, and coordinating educational opportunities and resources specific to the interest and needs that emerge from these partnerships.

Position Details

Position: Indigenous Outreach & Engagement Coordinator

Location: remote from home office

Hours of Work: 35 hours/week (option of 28 hours/week if desired)

Duration: 1 year with possibility of extension

Salary: \$55,000 - \$60,000/year FTE, depending on qualifications and experience

Responsibilities:

 Build and nurture relationships and partnerships with First Nation communities, Indigenous groups and/or organizations in Ontario interested in collaborating around agricultural education and knowledge sharing.

- Work with the Anishinabek Nation (that EFAO has been collaborating with over the past few years) to explore and coordinate opportunities for collaboration with communities and members in northeastern Ontario.
- Design and implement strategies to assess community interests and needs, and collaboratively develop opportunities in response to those interests and needs.
- Organize and coordinate educational and networking events, including farm tours, field days, webinars, workshops and regional gatherings. Events can occur both in-person and online.
- Facilitate one-on-one mentorship opportunities for Indigenous growers.
- Work closely with EFAO's Indigenous Outreach & Engagement Steering
 Committee as well as other staff members engaged in EFAO's education work.
- In collaboration with EFAO's Communications & Engagement Director, develop and implement a communication and outreach strategy for educational activities, using print, online, and in-person methods (when appropriate).
- For online events, and when appropriate, work with other team members to edit and share event recordings and materials.
- Support grant management including tracking deliverables, managing event and project budgets and preparing reports.
- Support EFAO's commitment to anti-racism and equity through participation in relevant professional development opportunities.
- In collaboration with EFAO's Operations Director and evaluation consultants, support the development and implementation of an evaluation strategy that engages Indigenous partners in the evaluation design and that utilizes culturally appropriate data collection approaches.

- Strong interpersonal skills with a demonstrated ability to build relationships and work collaboratively
- Working knowledge, experience and appreciation of food, farming and land stewardship within an Indigenous context
- Alignment with EFAO's anti-racism and equity goals, or related lived or work experience
- Ability to work both independently and as part of a dynamic staff team
- Experience with Microsoft Office suite, Google documents and virtual meeting platforms (i.e. Zoom)
- Some offsite, evening and weekend work, and travel required
