# Farmer-led Research Year-in-Review 2019

In 2019, EFAO's Farmer-Led Research Program was the recipient of the inaugural **Excellence in Agriculture Award** from the Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs. The award recognizes the importance of farmer-led research in addressing big challenges in agriculture. It also recognizes the hard work and innovation of the more than 30 farmers who received funding and support to conduct over 40 research trials from 2016 - 2018.
